

Payments bank: for the informal sector
Two kinds of banking licences that are granted by the Reserve Bank of India - universal bank licence and differentiated bank licence. Payments bank comes under a differentiated bank licence since it cannot offer all the services that a commercial bank offers.

Even before demonetisation, informal sector jobs barely grew: NSSO data
This suggests some of the informal sector enterprises either cut employment or hardly added jobs to protect margins even before the note ban in November last year accelerated the pace of churning in the informal sector.
